



Technical Bulletin Installation: Greenstar 1000 Combi

COMMISSIONING

It is important that newly installed boilers are run for at least 10 minutes before gas rates are checked and subsequent flue gas readings are taken.

Due to there being a protective film which covers & protects the insulation pads on Greenstar 1000 Combis, it is important that they are run for at least 10 minutes before any combustion analysis is carried out. This allows time for the film to be burnt off and for combustion readings to normalise.

In the short period whilst this film is burning off, you may notice a small amount of smoke and a different smell from the flue terminal. CO figures may also be elevated.

The same will apply if the insulation pads are ever replaced. The film must remain in place whilst they are installed and should be allowed to burn off, it should not be removed.
